LEADERSHIP CHANGES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF MEDICINE

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On May 2, 2022, Dr. Anne Pereira assumed the role of Interim Chair of the Department of Medicine following the announcement of Dr. Arti Prasad's new role in the Hennepin Healthcare System. Dr. Pereira has a long relationship within the Department of Medicine. She completed her Internal Medicine Residency at HCMC in 1998 followed by Chief Residency in 1999. While she completed an MPH in Clinical Effectiveness and a Fellowship in General Internal Medicine at Harvard Medical School in 2002, Dr. Pereira joined the HCMC medical staff in 2003 where she has maintained a clinical practice. Dr. Pereira's leadership experience includes Program Director for the Internal Medicine Residency at HCMC from 2005 to 2014, Co-Program Director for the Emergency Medicine/Internal Medicine Residency at HCMC from 2006 to 2014, Assistant Dean for Clinical Education, and Assistant Dean for Medical School Curriculum at the University of Minnesota Medical School from 2014 to 2020 and serving

on the HHS Board of Directors. In 2021 Dr. Pereira completed a Hospice and owship at the University of Minnesota. She currently practices as a Palliative Medicine clinician at HHS and until May 2022, served as the Medical Director for Palliative Medicine. Dr. Pereira is a Professor of Medicine at the University of Minnesota.

Dr. Pereira has spent her first few months meeting with faculty, hospital leadership, staff and others to identify where her leadership strengths should be directed in meeting the mission of delivering outstanding and compassionate clinical service to all populations, especially the underserved, while providing superior education for providers in training, and advancing medical knowledge through research. Her directions are focusing on department provider health and wellness as we work through these challenging times of COVID-19, with attention to equality and social justice for our patients and staff.

Dr. Pereira succeeds **Dr. Arti Prasad**, who has led the Department of Medicine as Chair since August 7, 2017. In her five years of Department leadership Dr. Prasad has created a Department leadership team that worked closely with her on many department aspects

from budgeting, staffing, equity and social justice, and provider

health and wellness.

Dr. Prasad oversaw the development of the Department's Equity and Social Justice Office and appropriated grant money for divisional health and wellness funds to support the providers and staff. Dr. Prasad, in her role as Chair of Medicine, was invited to join the Hennepin Healthcare Board of Directors, and the HHRI Operations Committee among other hospital-wide committees she served on during her leadership as Chair of Medicine. Dr. Prasad has accepted the role of Chief Strategic Development Officer working under Jennifer DeCubellis, CEO and other Executive Leadership Team (ELT) members.

As Dr. Prasad transitions to her new role, she will continue to provide leadership oversight for Project ECHO and the Integrative Health Program.
